What is Rail Central?

- A Strategic Rail Freight Interchange (SRFI)
- A response to increasing consumer demands for wider product choice and faster deliveries
- A response to industry demands for fast, efficient and sustainable supply chains
- A response to Government policy for expansion of rail freight, to help decarbonise transport, address global climate change and reduce long-distance lorry traffic
- An opportunity to underpin South Northamptonshire's economy inc. 8,000 jobs
- A significant inward investment opportunity
- A planning proposal being developed for submission later this year



What is an SRFI? – Government definition

"A Strategic Rail Freight Interchange (SRFI) is a large multi-purpose rail freight interchange and distribution centre linked into both the rail and trunk road system. It has rail-connected warehousing and container handling facilities and may also include manufacturing and processing activities."

National Planning Statement for National Networks (NPS NN), 2014








New dedicated access via A43







What's special about Rail Central?

- A national distribution hub, linking deep-sea ports and land-bridge services to mainland Europe and China with the rest of Britain
- The only SRFI capable of access to two separate main line routes, both with electrification and enough headroom for tall containers
- The only SRFI offering a complete suite of rail freight interchange facilities (intermodal, conventional and express) with main line access optimised for both express (WCML) and standard speed freight trains
- The only SRFI capable of handling and maintaining freight trains, reducing the need for empty train movements to and from the main line
- Track layout alongside main line allows trains to serve the site en route to/from other SRFI, increasing opportunities for joint working



Consultation

- Consulting in line with an agreed SoCC
- Formal Phase One started 28 April and ended 21 October 2016
- 8 public exhibitions attended by approximately 1,000 people
- Local Liaison Group established
- Approximately 300 submitted pieces of feedback
- Variety of issues and themes
- Design continues to evolve some important changes made
- Further public exhibitions as part of Phase Two from September
- Consultation informs both scheme design and mitigation




What we've been doing since Phase 1
